Legal aid provides free help with basic civil legal issues. **Depending on the legal problem NPLS will provide advice by telephone or an in-person appointment.**

Areas of Legal Help:

Economic Stability:

- Situations that result in loss of job, disability, or other barriers to employment
- Eligibility for public benefits

Preserving Your Home:

- Priorities include loss of home through uninhabitability, eviction or foreclosure

Support for Families:

- General advice to parents about custody and/or visitation
- Child support

Safety:

- Support for domestic violence victims including Protection from Abuse Orders

Populations with Special Vulnerabilities:

- Help for seniors including powers of attorney, living wills, nursing home quality of care issues
- Children denied enrollment to school

What We Need to Know Before You Call Us:

Before calling be sure to have any paperwork, letters, leases, contracts, etc.,

regarding your problem with you. The advocate may ask for this information.

When you call, your eligibility will be screened by an intake worker to see that you qualify for free services under the regulations set by our funding sources.

What You Can Expect from NPLS ?

If you are eligible for services, your case will be reviewed by an advocate. The advocate may provide advice or educational information on the telephone that will help you understand or resolve your situation. The advocate may also provide information about other human services organizations which may be of help to you.

Where telephone advice is not appropriate, we will schedule an office visit with an NPLS advocate or may refer a volunteer attorney through the Pro Bono project.
